



#### Public questions on Catholic spirituality, moral & spiritual problems

**Q.** If you get married in Jamaica, can you come back to the States and have your marriage blessed by the Catholic Church? **A.** Answer by a Catholic Apologist: Getting married in Jamaica is not an impediment to a valid marriage, and those who validly marry there are not required to travel to the United States to have their marriage blessed, or convalidated. Catholics are required to be married in the Church; if one marries outside the Church, whether in or out of the United States, then one's marriage will not be valid unless it is later convalidated. To deliberately marry outside of the Church and live as husband and wife is not a minor irregularity that one can always plan to straighten out later; it is a grave betrayal of our obligation as Catholics to live by the law of the Church and a sin against God, in whose eyes the marriage is nonexistent.

# **Today's Gospel Meditation**

### The 2<sup>nd</sup> of Five Sundays Prior to The Great Fast

### **HUMILITY** in the Presence of God & Neighbor

Jesus was constantly combating the self-righteousness that he found such a sinister enemy of spiritual progress. This parable is addressed directly to the self-



righteous. The Pharisee and the tax collector are stereotypes of the good and the sinful person. The **Pharisee** prays with straightforward gratitude for his healthy spiritual state. There is no sign that he is trying to deceive. Pharisees did fast severely twice a week, on Mondays and Thursdays, for the good of the whole nation. And there is no reason to doubt that he tithed. *The tragedy is that he does not understand the flawed nature of this prayer.* He is deceiving himself. He does not look upon himself as God's servant but as one who deserves good of God for a job well done. Besides this pride, he is guilty of contempt for the tax collector. The **Publican** is conscious of his

sinfulness. He knows that he does not deserve consideration because of anything he has done. The prayer he utters is one of the sources of the ancient Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner." It is this helplessness and dependence that opens one to God's grace; it is the spirit of the child. Earlier Jesus commended one who would say, after doing good work that was a duty, "We are unprofitable servants" (17:10). The debate over faith and works is already engaged here (see Rom 3:27-4:5). Jesus Himself draws the shocking conclusion from the parable: the observant Pharisee goes home unjustified; the sinful tax collector is justified. The reversal maxim concludes the story.

### SIMPLE ABSTINENCE IS MITIGATED THIS WEEK

The Church looks upon every Friday as a special day of remembrance of Our Lord's salvific death upon the Precious Cross. Fasting/Abstinence are a reminder that we must be



humbly grateful to Jesus for dying for our sins. However, there are certain Fridays throughout the liturgical life that we put aside this penitential character for other didactical expressions. For example, this *Friday following the Sunday of the Publican & Pharisee, simple abstinence is mitigated so that we focus on the fact that abstinence is not an end.* Christ is our end and He is the only One Who can save us. We cannot save ourselves even if we were to fast

every day! For we who are used to abstaining from meat or doing an equivalent penance each Friday, this is difficult, but necessary to keep us humble and to focus on the value of what fasting and abstinence truly accomplish. It then aids in strengthening us at the appropriate times when we are called to its practice.



### **SAINT OF THE WEEK**

# Our Venerable Father Maximus the Confessor January 21

Saint Maximus the Confessor was born in Constantinople around 580 and raised in a pious Christian family. He received an excellent education, studying philosophy, grammar, and rhetoric.



He was well-read in the authors of antiquity and he also mastered philosophy and theology. When St Maximus entered government service, he became first secretary and chief counselor to the emperor Heraclius (611-641), who was impressed by his knowledge and virtuous life. St Maximus soon realized that the emperor and many others had been corrupted by the Monothelite heresy which falsely taught that in the Lord Jesus Christ there was only one nature (the divine). Influenced by this erroneous opinion, the Monothelite heretics said that in Christ there was only one divine will and only one divine energy. It was spreading rapidly through the East. He resigned from his duties at court, and went to the Chrysopolis monastery (on the opposite shore of the Bosphorus), where he received monastic tonsure. Because of his humility and wisdom, he soon won the love of the brethren and

was chosen Hegumen of the monastery after a few years. Even in this position, he remained a simple monk. In 638, the emperor Heraclius and Patriarch Sergius tried to minimize the importance of differences in belief. In defending True Worship, St Maximus spoke to people in various occupations and positions, and these conversations were successful. Not only the clergy and the bishops, but also the people and the secular officials felt some sort of invisible attraction to him, as we read in his Life. When St Maximus saw what turmoil this heresy caused in Constantinople and in the East, he decided to leave his monastery and seek refuge in the West, where Monothelitism had been completely rejected. On the way, he visited the bishops of Africa, strengthening them in True Worship, and not to be deceived by the cunning arguments of the heretics. The Fourth Ecumenical Council had condemned the Monophysite heresy. The saint spent six years in Alexandria and the surrounding area. The Lord revealed to St Maximus the time of his death (August 13, 662). Three candles appeared over the grave of St Maximus and burned miraculously. This was a sign that St Maximus was a beacon of True Worship during his lifetime, and continues to shine forth as an example of virtue for all. Many healings occurred at his tomb.



**EIGHT DAYS OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY ENDS THIS THURS**—Each year from January 18-25, Christians unite to pray in the same sentiments that Jesus prayed to the Father: "That all

may be one ... so that the world may believe." (John 17:21). This year's theme is: "You shall love the Lord your God ... And your neighbor as yourself" (Lk. 10:27). As Catholics who have the fullness of the faith that Jesus established, let us pray that others may be drawn into its truth. some of the consecrated wine runs down the outside of your mouth **DO NOT WIPE IT AWAY**WITH YOUR HAND, BUT USE THE CLOTH LENTION NEXT TO THE CHALICE. THIS IS
NO LONGER WINE. BUT THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF OUR SAVIOR.
